# BUILDING BRIGHTER FUTURES BY PRESERVING OUR SHARED PAST

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude for the incredible growth and achievements of the UWF Historic Trust. Our commitment to preserving history and sharing the culture, art and stories of Northwest Florida has never been stronger. The changing face of our organization is a testament to the dedication and support of our community.



In October of 2023, we opened the Escambia County Medical Society Foundation Kid's Clinic on the second floor of the Pensacola Children's Museum. The new, permanent exhibit familiarizes children with the experience of going to the doctor and educates them on the processes and professionals involved in various medical visits. The exhibit was a community effort, with nearly \$100,000 funded by various local medical groups. These supporters included Escambia County Medical Society Foundation, who helped solicit donations and contributions, as well as Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart, Pensacola Pediatrics, and Touchstone Medical Imaging.

Another exciting development on our site was the construction of the new Barbara Goggins Train Pavilion outside of the Museum of Industry. The new train canopy area includes a restored locomotive and flat car formerly owned by the T.R. Miller Mill Company as well as an L&N caboose. The revitalized space at the corner of Zaragoza and Tarragona includes a train canopy, interpretive panels and a refurbished engine for visitors to explore. Without generous contributions from Barbara Goggins, Tom McMillan and the McMillan family, this project would not have been possible.

Your contributions have enabled us to expand our programs, reach new audiences and make a lasting impact on our region. As we look ahead to the coming year, we are excited about the possibilities that lie ahead. We are confident that with your ongoing support, we can continue our mission of preserving, interpreting, collecting and sharing the history of Northwest Florida. Thank you for your support.

# A PORT IN PERIL: MARITIME MEDICINE IN PENSACOLA

September 2023 - March 2025

The exhibit showcased the beginnings of modern medicine and the impact of disease on a vulnerable maritime population through the use of quarantine stations and medical artifacts.

#### FIESTA 75TH ANNIVERSARY COSTUME SHOWCASE


February 2 - April 7, 2024
